Date and place: Written about 45 A.D. at Jerusalem before the first Christian council

Author: James

Theme: Faith that works

Purpose: (1) To encourage believers suffering from various trials that are testing their faith. (2) To correct erroneous ideas about the nature of saving faith and (3) To exhort and instruct readers about the practical out workings of their faith in righteous living and good deeds.

Statistics: 59th book of the Bible 5 chapters






